



Chinese NFSS (6.5.5) pilot test

September 2018 – July 2020

Objective:

 To test alternative ways of conforming with Indicator 6.5.5 (focused on setting aside 10% of the forest unit as a designated conservation area) in specific regions in China where conformity is a challenge for smallholders

Geography & Unique Needs:

- Guangdong, Guangxi, and Shandong provinces
- Smallholders predominantly manage plantations over small and scattered patches of land
- Smallholders with very limited resources
- Dominance of agricultural farm land and plantations

Activities/Methodology:

 Recruited and launched chamber-balanced Working Group of 3 members (2 of them involved in developing current FSC national standard) including IKEA, WWF, and Chinese Academy of Forestry (CAF)

- Developed a Standard Operating Procedure to guide the pilot test
- Developed a technical assessment framework for the identified alternatives
- Trained smallholder certificate holders and certification bodies
- Developing risk assessment methodology and templates
