



Project Name: Smallholders Access Program pilot test January 2019 – January 2021

Objective:

 To test the Smallholder Access Program (SAP) standard developed by Rainforest Alliance as part of their Appalachian Woodland Alliance project

Geography & Unique Needs:

- Appalachian region in the South and South East USA
- Private ownership of small family forests
- Natural forests with natural regeneration
- Forests only accessed every few decades for harvest
- Degraded forests, low levels of law enforcement
- Scarcity of FSC-certified material

Activities/Methodology:

- Developed a Smallholders Access Program (SAP) standard
- Developed a Standard Operating Procedure
