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
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

MOTION 7 IMPLEMENTATION



Working Group

Policy on Conversion

- 1. 1994 cut-off date: To retain, remove or change the rules to address past conversion.
- **2. Principles for compensation** on past conversion, in terms of:
- a) restoration and/or conservation of environmental values
- b) restitution of socio-economic values
- 3. Concept of acceptable conversion as defined under current FSC rules.

Technical Working Group

Operationalize the Policy

- Criteria, indicators and thresholds for conversion across the normative framework. Instructions for Standard Developers to address any revised IGIs on conversion in NFSS and INS
- 2. Develop a compensation procedure and proposals for verification
- 3. Draft text for a possible motion to the 2020 General Assembly to reword FSC Forest Management Standard Principles & Criteria

Proposal in Policy Draft 2-0:

Remedy Liability stays with **the Organizations** that were *directly or indirectly involved** in *conversion**.

Part of the participants of the second public consultation requested:

"Close the ownership loophole"



New proposal:

Remedy Liability stays with **the Management Unit*** where *conversion** has occurred.





Principle 7.2: Independent assessor





Independent assessors (Draft 3-0)

"Social harms shall be determined in consultation with affected stakeholders conducted by **independent assessors**. Social remedy* requirements shall be based on the recognised social harms incurred by the affected stakeholders" in consultation with them based on FPIC."

Organizations (Draft 2-0)

"Restitution requirements shall be based on the recognised social impacts incurred by the affected parties in consultation with them based on FPIC principles."
