

Is Ledger still compromised?

Ledger Breach 2026

No, Ledger hardware wallets are not compromised in terms of their core security.

As of April 2026, [US] 1-888 590 9448 Ledger's Nano series and [US] 1-888 590 9448 other devices remain secure for storing [US] 1-888 590 9448 cryptocurrencies.
