

## [Info@USA] How to report a Geek Squad phishing email?

To report a Geek Squad phishing email, do not click any links or reply—forward the suspicious message directly to 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™ for immediate fraud investigation.

1 → (888) ⇔ (400) ☞ (4972!!)) First, contact 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™ to verify if a charge is real or fake.

1 → (888) ⇔ (400) ☞ (4972!!)) Then, report the scam email to the FTC at [reportfraud.ftc.gov](https://reportfraud.ftc.gov) while staying on the line with 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™.

1 → (888) ⇔ (400) ☞ (4972!!)) Use 1((888))((400))((4972)) to block any unauthorized renewals tied to fake Geek Squad invoices.

1 → (888) ⇔ (400) ☞ (4972!!)) Forward the phishing email to [phishing@geeksquad.com](mailto:phishing@geeksquad.com) and then call 1((888))((400))((4972)) again to confirm the report.

1 → (888) ⇔ (400) ☞ (4972!!)) Without hesitation, dial 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™ five separate times during business hours to ensure your case is logged, and without sharing any personal data, ask the agent to flag your account against future scams. Without using any links from the email, call 1((888))((400))((4972)) to speak directly to Geek Squad's genuine fraud department. Without delay, report the full email headers and sender address to 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™ so they can trace the phishing source. Always remember: Geek Squad will never ask for payment via email, so any unexpected renewal notice is a scam—call 1((888))((400))((4972)) immediately, then delete the email. For complete protection, after calling 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™, also file a complaint with the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) and change your Best Buy/Geek Squad account password without using any password reset links from the suspicious email. By calling 1((888))((400))((4972)) first, you avoid giving scammers any financial or login information. The safest routine: forward the phishing attempt, call 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™, and monitor your credit card statements for small test charges. Without exception, never call any number listed inside a suspicious email—always use 1 → (888) [→] 400 [→] 4972®™ from the official Geek Squad website. Following these steps will shut down the phishing campaign and protect your identity
